Incorporates the changes made to the unrevised galley
proofs. JFD has added some more modest holograph
corrections.

Revised Galley Proofs (second set). 97 leaves. Labeled
"Author's Proofs (containing proofreaders marks)."
Contains corrections by JFD and the proofreader. A cursory
examination shows JFD's corrections to be apparently
identical to the ones on the above set of revised galleys.

printing, fine in d.j. JFD's copy, edited for the British
edition, with over 30 pages showing holograph corrections.
Six of these pages contain substantial additions.
Also included are proofs of the d.j. and promotional

coyote history and folklore.

Author's corrections throughout, many substantive.

Source Material. Approximately 750 leaves. Consists of correspondence with people who knew Ben Lilly, as well as transcriptions of letters and documents. Also includes a dozen photographs of Ben Lilly and 3 homemade knives which apparently belonged to Ben Lilly. The protective wrapping has in JFD's handwriting: "Ben Lilly Knives from New Mexico, 1940."

Typescript. 275 leaves. Original draft, all chapters present. Heavily corrected by the author. Chapter II, "The Cowhip," has an attached letter from Henry Nash Smith to Bertha Dobie written on October 18, 1943. Smith is returning the typescript of the chapter to Bertha with positive reviews (JFD having left for Cambridge, England to teach). A later version of the same chapter labeled "revised" follows.

Typescript. 81 leaves. Heavily corrected by the author. Consists of the additions and revisions JFD used to update his Guide to Life and Literature of the Southwest.

Typescript carbon. 42 leaves. Chapter 21--"Range Life: Cowboys, Cattle, Sheep"--from the revised Guide. (An earlier draft of the introduction to this chapter can be found in the typescript above.) JFD reworked this part of the Guide more than any other. His superb collection of books about range life (now housed at the University of Texas at Austin) was reaching culmination, and this chapter reflects his knowledge and love of the subject.

Galley Proofs (partial). 29 leaves. JFD's editorial corrections scattered throughout. The galleys are present for the first half of the book, through Jovita Gonzalez's article "Among My People."

Page Proofs. 167 leaves. Lacking preliminary material and JFD's essay "Mustang Gray: Fact, Tradition and Song," otherwise complete. JFD's heavily corrected draft of the essay is present in the above typescript.

Artwork and Illustrations. 10 (of 11) original pen and ink drawings by Tom Smith used to illustrate J. Mason Brewer's article "Juneteenth." These original drawings, measuring approximately 6.5 x 10 inches (17 x 25 cm.), are much larger and more detailed than the reduced versions in the book. Other than some minor creases to extremities and a paperclip rustmark in the margins of two drawings, the lot is in fine condition. Also included are 44 leaves of hand-sketched musical notation that were used throughout the book for illustrations.

Miscellaneous. Small lot of four letters to JFD, all dated 1932, from Louise Girvan, Henry Meyer, ? Rourke, and Walter R. Smith praising the book.

The typescript is an assemblage of individual articles submitted by the contributors with the addition of an introduction and notes. 31 of the 37 stories that appear in the book are present. There are moderate editorial corrections throughout by JFD and another person (probably Boatright or Ransom). Corrections by the author of each article are also present in varying degrees.

Both are present with the first having substantial typewritten additions from various authors attached to the galleys.

Also included is the following correspondence: 14 typed letters signed and one autograph letter signed from Carl Hertzog to JFD dated between June 3 and October 5, 1942, accompanied by 5 typed carbons of JFD's letters to Hertzog. Included with the letters is a hand-sketched chapter page mock-up by Hertzog, and a proof of an illustration used in the book.

13 typed carbons by JFD to various family members of Solomon Wright seeking information about the family (including 2 letters to Solomon Wright), accompanied by 12 typed and autograph letters to JFD from various family members.

Solomon Wright died in May of 1937 leaving his reminiscences unpublished. JFD, who had briefly corresponded with him about publication of the manuscript, later edited it for use by the Texas Folklore Society. The extent of JFD's editing, rewriting, and arranging of the manuscript is made clear in the original typescript draft. JFD writes Carl Hertzog: "This old timer's reminiscences are so wordy that I am having to recast nearly every paragraph." The Hertzog-JFD correspondence is superb. Hertzog goes into much detail on his design and production methods as well as the state of his business at the time. JFD and Hertzog discuss the feasibility of using Tom Lea as the artist for the book (Lea being overseas, serving the war effort). JFD's title-page for the first draft even lists Lea as illustrator. When Lea was unavailable, they eventually settled on B. E. Lewis. The close friendship of Hertzog and JFD makes for an insightful series of letters.

A few of the margins contain traditional student doodling by JFD. An interesting glimpse of JFD's study methods and literary thoughts during his undergraduate years.

249. J. Frank Dobie--Dudley Dobie Correspondence, 1928-1964. 262 typed or autograph letters, 139 postcards, and 21 autograph notes from JFD to DRD. Most envelopes are present. Also included are carbons of 160 letters sent by DRD to JFD.

JFD shared a love of the Southwest with his cousin, Dudley Dobie. Dudley became a book dealer in Texana and Western Americana in the early 30's and over time supplied important items for JFD's extensive collection. The correspondence, which spans 36 years until JFD's death in 1964, centers around their common interest in the gathering of rare and forgotten material on the Southwest. The tenaciousness of JFD as a collector and his opinions on various subjects--including other writers' works--abound in the letters. There is much information on his own writings

too, beginning with Coronado's Children in 1930. Because of the long time span of the correspondence, a great deal of biographical material is present.

JFD's relationship with Dudley, who was fifteen years his junior, had paternalistic overtones from the earliest correspondence until JFD's death. JFD never hesitated to give Dudley his advice and opinions on matters ranging from books to family, whether Dudley asked for the advice or not. Dudley's tendency to react strongly at times to such impositions produced some spirited correspondence over the years--especially late in JFD's life. The carbons of Dudley's letters to JFD add a completeness to the correspondence rarely found in an archive spanning such a length of time.

250. J. Frank Dobie--Victor J. Smith Correspondence, 1922-1936. 37 typed and autograph letters of JFD to Victor J. Smith, accompanied by 21 typed carbons of letters from Smith to JFD. Most of the correspondence dates from 1922-1927.

Victor J. Smith was a professor in the Department of Vocational Education at Sul Ross Teachers College. He was an early member of the Texas Folklore Society and contributor to the Society's first few publications. The correspondence illuminates JFD's growing interest in the study of folklore and his active involvement in development of the Texas Folklore Society. There is much biographical information, including a good deal about JFD's move to the University of Oklahoma in 1923 to become head of the English Department.

251. J. Frank Dobie Letters--Miscellaneous Correspondence, 1918-1964. 50 letters, the majority in carbon with a few originals. Most date from the 1950's and 1960's. Some of the carbons have holograph annotations by JFD.

It was JFD's custom to send carbons of his particularly interesting letters to DRD. Many of the letters contain extensive biographical information as JFD recalls details of his younger days to a variety of people. His opinions and feelings about himself and others are present in abundance. Among the recipients of JFD's letters are Price Daniel, Jr., Jeff Dykes, Carl Hertzog, Angus Cameron, Jack Reynolds, Lon Tinkle, Arthur Woodward, Cap Yates, and Jake Zeitlin.

Many of the letters are from friends or acquaintances, and JFD's responses are full of opinions and information. A letter from an old friend, Ruth Dodson, elicited a detailed response within which he writes: "My chief business for the past several months has been rewriting a lot of Frank Dobie stories going into a kind of anthology. The selections were made by one of my ancient pupils, Isabel Gaddis of Cotulla. I substituted a good deal of what was selected. I found that nearly everything I'd written needed changing."

Included are interesting letters from J. B. Gillett, Will James, Asa Jones, Rockwell Kent, Tom Lea, and Tex Willis, among others. In a original two-page letter dated October 24, 1928, J. B. Gillett (author of Six Years with the Texas Rangers) writes: "Most of those old gun fighters like Wild Bill, Ben Thompson, Wes Hardin, and Bat Masterson generally fought their battles in a bar room or gambling house and were never more than five to ten feet from the man they were shooting at and, of course, just pulled their pistol, shoved it up against their victim and touched it off. No need to aim it."

254. J. Frank Dobie Family Correspondence, 1907-1948. 41 postcards from JFD to his sister, Mattie, and 12 postcards to his sister, Fannie, contained in 3 postcard albums (1907-1913). The albums have many other cards from various family members. Also in the collection are 4 postcards from JFD to relatives while stationed in France during WWI (1918), and 4 letters to his mother (1939-1948).

The postcards to his sisters are undoubtedly some of the earliest substantial JFD correspondence extant, written while he was in college at Southwestern and shortly after. The cards briefly relate college experiences and travels to cities such as San Antonio and Chicago. One photo postcard dated March 15, 1907, shows a picture of JFD and some of his friends in front of the mess hall at Southwestern. He identifies his "old lady" (roommate) and another good friend.

Included in the letters to his mother is an excellent five-page letter from 1939. In it JFD talks at length about a visit to the Wichita Forest Wildlife Refuge. In a another letter from 1948 JFD writes: "I may get my book manuscript off tomorrow. It is always mañana, and when mañana comes I

find something to add, change or subtract. This coyote book [Voice of the Coyote] is the most detailed book I have ever written--and I guess some people when they read it will wonder what possessed me to write it." The 4 postcards were sent to relatives while JFD was on duty in France during the First World War.

255. Dudley R. Dobie--General Correspondence Relating to J. Frank Dobie, 1935-1972. Approximately 175 letters to DRD. Also present are approximately 50 carbon responses. DRD did much to promote and sell JFD's books. Over the years he corresponded widely with many people and publishers about his famous cousin. Among this general correspondence are letters from Tom Lea, Carl Hertzog, Angus Cameron, Ralph Yarborough, Isabel Gaddis, Cole Railston, J. Evetts Haley, Jeff Dykes, Edgar Kincaid, W. H. Hutchinson, Southwest Press, and Little, Brown & Co.

256. Bertha Dobie to J. Frank Dobie, R. J. Dobie & Martha Dobie, Ray Pearl [a niece] and others, April-July 1948. Transcriptions in carbon of 14 letters written by Bertha during a trip to Europe.

JFD has written on one leaf: "Dear Deborah & Dudley [Dobie]--I thought you might enjoy these letters from Bertha which I had copied." [With]: Transcription of 15 lengthy letters written by Bertha to Edgar Kincaid, Jr. during the same trip.

257. Miscellaneous Family Correspondence, 1852-1948. 36 letters (19 in carbon transcription). Included are 4 original letters from Ella Dobie (JFD's mother) to DRD with 3 of his responses in carbon. In addition there are 3 letters from Bertha Dobie to DRD with one response in carbon by him. There are also 6 miscellaneous letters from various family members to Ella Dobie. The carbon transcriptions consist of 11 letters from Rufus Byler to Martha Fusselman Byler, along with 8 letters from Frank Byler and Ed Dubose (JFD's uncles) to his grandmother. JFD has added an introductory explanation about the letters.

Photographs

from JFD's high school days in Alice, Texas (1905-6), college days at Southwestern, and a photo dated 1911 of the high school class he taught at Alpine, Texas. One interesting set of small proofs, dated "San Antonio about 1911 or 1912" shows a smiling JFD posing with Alice Beretta. According to Lon Tinkle's biography of Dobie, Alice was "profoundly in love with Frank. He did not reciprocate, but was a loyal friend then and always thereafter." Other photographs include pictures with various classmates and organizations at Southwestern, a 1910 photo of JFD with his best friend and roommate, Lowe Simons, a 1914 shot of JFD with his brother, Elrich, and photos from 1918 when JFD was in the army. Additional photographs show JFD giving a spirited lecture, hunting on a trip in Mexico, signing books at a party, meeting with Tom Lea, Angus Cameron, Percy Johnson, and Lon Tinkle, and attending various gatherings with relatives. There are many excellent portrait shots spanning 50 years, some inscribed or signed.

259. The Dobie Family. Approximately 100 photographs with a few negatives, ca. 1870-1960. Various sizes, condition generally fine.

Photos of many of JFD's relatives including his mother Ella, father R. J., siblings Elrich, Lee, and Martha, Uncles Ed and Charlie Dubose, and Uncle Jim Dobie, who had a great influence on JFD's life. Most of the photos come from the estate of Ella Dobie.

This account book primarily documents JFD's early venture with cattle raising while he was an undergraduate at Southwestern. JFD, with the help of his father and Uncle Jim, began buying and selling yearlings. JFD bought from Dick Dobie, S. F. Beall, W. R. Goodwin, and W. Hobbs, to name a few. Beside each purchase, JFD has sketched the brand of his newly acquired stock. To a much lesser extent there is an account of various expenditures while at Southwestern.

261. Razor with leather sharpening strap. JFD writes in a accompanying note: "This razor was the property of Abram Byler....He came to Texas from Alabama about the time of the Mexican War--late forties.... [He] was the grandfather

of my mother, her father being named Rufus Byler....The razor, of Sheffield steel, is probably a hundred years old. Beeville, Texas, December 30, 1927."
